Historic St. Mary's City is a National Historic Landmark, a uniquely well-preserved archaeological record of more than 10,000 years of human occupation — including archaeological artifacts left by native peoples and European colonists. Today, the site is home to a living history museum that engages both students and the general public in educational programs through novel and exciting ways, encouraging people of all ages to connect the past with their contemporary lives.

STATE HOUSE

Explore the reconstructed brick State House, erected in 1934, and delve into Maryland's colonial government history. Discover the initial capital before its relocation to Annapolis.



BRICK CHAPEL

Explore the reconstructed brick chapel, delve into topics such as religious toleration, persecution, and architecture, and visit the exhibit showcasing rare lead coffins found through archaeology.



TOWN CENTER

Explore the variety of businesses that thrived in St. Mary's City during the 1600s and delve into how this information has been uncovered – through archaeology and extensive research.

REDISCOVERING THE PAST

Approximately 3.5 hours

Tour the Visitor Center, St. John's Site Museum, Town Center, and Brick Chapel to discover how historians and archaeologists piece together stories of the past.

Appropriate for age 13 and older



ST. JOHN'S SITE

Visit a contemporary archaeological exhibition situated above an active dig site. St. John's offers visitors a comprehensive overview of one of colonial Maryland's pivotal locations, highlighting how archaeological endeavors contribute to unraveling the historical narrative.





HISTORIC HIGHLIGHTS

Learn of the Yaocomaco people and other neighboring tribes. Join HSMC staff in learning of the fundamental skills necessary for the creation and administration of a small village.



TOBACCO PLANTATION

Experience a glimpse into the daily life of a Tobacco Plantation in the 1600s. Explore religious toleration and the Chesapeake tobacco trade economy as you step back in time.



TOWN CENTER

Explore the variety of businesses that thrived in St. Mary's City during the 1600s and delve into how this information has been uncovered – through archaeology and extensive research.



WATERFRONT

Discover the journey to Maryland, colonial maritime trade, the daily life aboard ships, and the 17th-century navigation technology that enabled sailors to traverse the Atlantic Ocean.

Woodland Indian Hamlet

A series of structures representing what may have been a small village of the Yaocomaco, the tribe living in the area in 1634.

Town Center

Reconstructed buildings on their original foundations. Guests can discover the stories and people of the city, from innkeeper or storehouse owner to the first female printer in the southern colonies.

Godiah Spray Tobacco Plantation

A recreated tobacco farm that shows everyday life, livestock, and objects from the 1600s.

Waterfront

Features a representation of a 17th-century cargo ship. Visitors may step on board and learn about navigational tools, life at sea, and maritime technologies. More info on *Maryland Dove* can be found on www.MarylandDove.org

St. John's Site Museum

This indoor site (with unexcavated remains left for public viewing) tells the story of a structure, and it's change of use over time.

Brick Chapel (ca. 1667)

Sitting on its original foundation, the chapel stands as a symbol of religious freedom.

St. Mary's Fort

With the archaeological remains discovered in 2019, St. Mary's Fort of 1634 is an ongoing excavation, with the potential to unearth new information about Maryland's pre-colonial and early colonial past.

Struggle for Freedom Exhibit

Housed inside a duplex quarter built in the 1840s, the exhibit tells the story of three generations, through enslavement, emancipation and the struggle of a tenant farmer in the early 20th century.



ACCESSIBILITY

Most outdoor areas at Historic St. Mary's City are wheelchair and stroller accessible.

- Maryland Dove main deck is accessible. The cargo hold is not.
- The main house of the Tobacco Plantation is not accessible.
- The second floor of the State House is not accessible.
- Print text and images will be provided.
